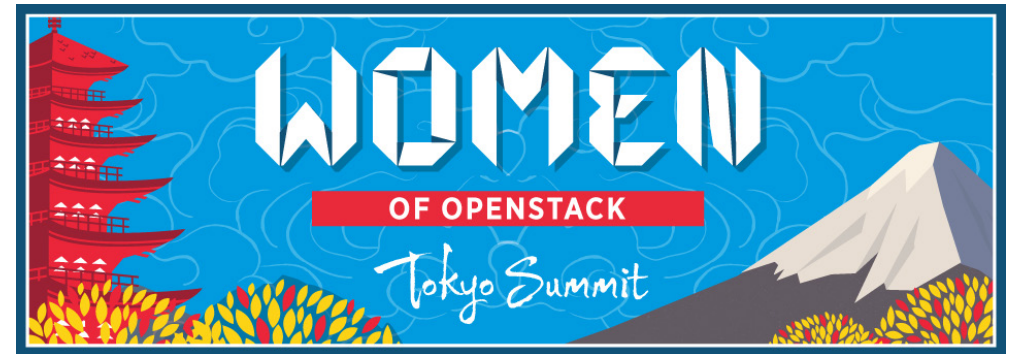
**We're still a minority.** We're growing, but encouraging women's outreach efforts and finding ways to evoke more front-row participation in the open source arena remains a key factor.

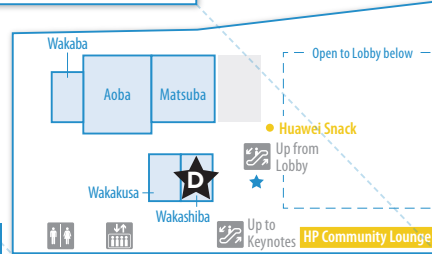
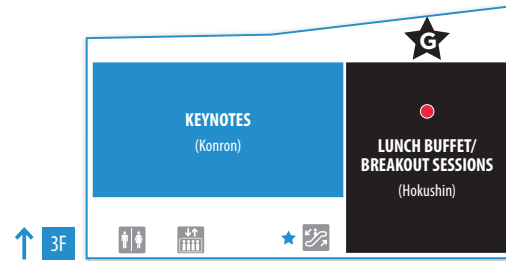
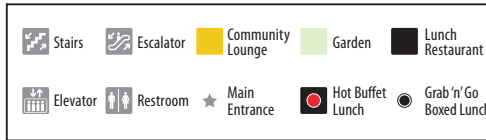
